



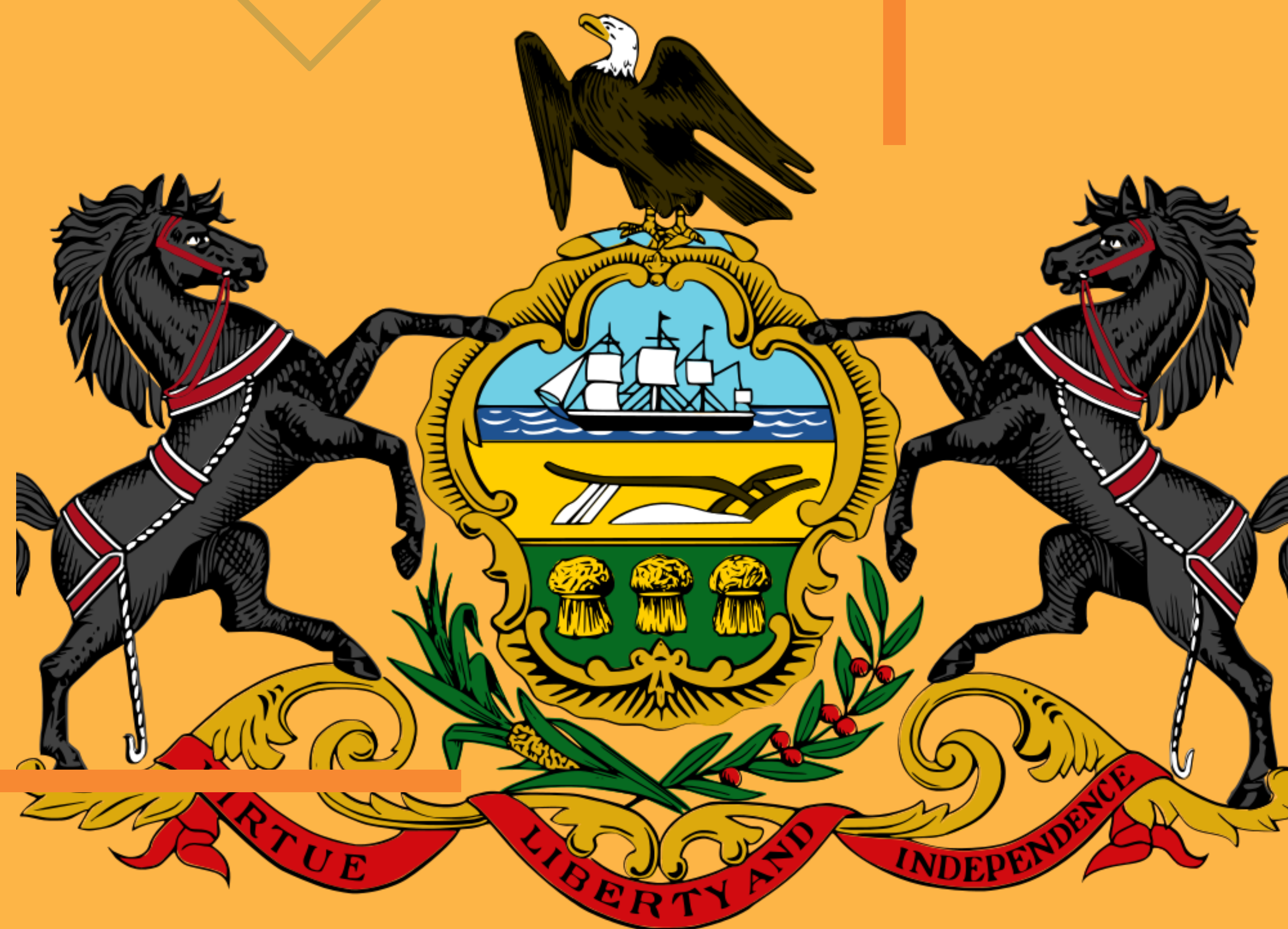

Rosedale Banishment Historical Marker Unveiling on Nov. 9
Commemorates 100th Anniversary of Pennsylvania's Largest Ethnic
Cleansing

[Johnstown, Pa], [11/9/2023] - The Johnstown NAACP and the local
genealogical society are honored to unveil a historical marker from the
Pennsylvania Historical and Museum Commission that will
acknowledge one of the worst racial injustices in the state's history.

The Rosedale Banishment, which took place a century ago, involved
the forced removal and expulsion of a significant ethnic population
from the Rosedale region in Pennsylvania. This devastating event
affected countless lives and left an indelible mark on the community.

The marker will be unveiled at a special ceremony at Hinckston Run
Dam, located off Waterfall Road, to commemorate this tragic
milestone. Later, there will be an event at the Johnstown Area Heritage
Association in Johnstown. The association, known for preserving and
